I was fortunate to meet Beth Armstrong at the Notes On Blindness event hosted by the Park City Library and Moran Eye Center in 2018. We discussed the need for diabetic eye screening for the patient population at the People's Health Clinic and I started volunteering one night per month to help fill this need. Diabetes can cause significant problems in the retina leading to permanent blindness, but luckily if this is caught early, it can be treated and vision can be preserved.

I have helped screen hundreds of patients over the last several years, and PHC does a wonderful job connecting patients that have signs of diabetic retinopathy to Retina specialists in the community to receive treatment. There are still many more patients that need ophthalmic exams, and we have recently started utilizing new technology (through a research grant) to take photos of the retina as a means of screening. This is very exciting innovation to effectively screen a larger number of patients that otherwise may not receive care. We live in a wonderful resort community, but need to recognize the population here in need; Peoples Health Clinic does a superb job at delivering high quality health care to these individuals and I am delighted to be a part of that.



Women's Health Services Patients' Share Their Experiences at People's Health Clinic by Rachelle Flinn, PA

Every week we see patients whose stories touch us. People's Health Clinic's Women's Health Services have helped several young women deliver healthy and strong babies in our community. I have had the chance to see the big picture and think about the impact the Clinic has on our community every day. Below, I have captured comments from our clients that they've shared with me about their experiences with Women's Health Services at PHC:

"I was not sure if I was pregnant but the staff was so helpful in making me comfortable to schedule an appointment to see a doctor. Once I knew I was pregnant, the doctor helped prepare me for a healthy pregnancy with ultrasounds."





"I like seeing my doctor every time. She really knows me now. I like knowing that she or one of her partners will be delivering my baby. Sometimes I feel proud when she tells me I'm gaining the right amount of weight and that the baby's heart sounds strong."

"I have tried 3 different types of birth control that all gave me bad side effects. I have a one year old and I do not want to get pregnant right now. Thank you so much to the Clinic for helping me find the birth control that is right for me."



Hypertension Certification Program by Tristan Lubina, DNP

In 2021, People's Health Clinic hired Tristan Lubina, who implemented a hypertension management program. Since then, PHC providers have seen over 200 patients diagnosed with hypertension. The hypertension program has made it possible to give out home blood pressure monitoring cuffs to patients, improve medication compliance, allow for quicker follow-up, and has increased the hypertension control rate to 80%. We have also joined Target: BP™, a national initiative formed to manage hypertension by the American Heart Association (AHA) and the American Medical Association (AMA). We are reaching high levels in our hypertension management and have applied for two awards in order to share our success with other clinics in our community.



Joanna UDOH Grant Health Worker

My name is Joanna Saucedo, and I am a Community Health Worker for the People's Health Clinic. With the support of a grant from the Utah Department of Health, my position seeks to address health inequities within our community. In addition, I will be implementing an outreach program to connect our diabetic patients with services and quality care through our clinic. Alongside advocating for legislative changes that will directly benefit families in our community, and gathering data on important issues affecting early childhood education and development, the Alliance actively supports early years parenting and education through a range of community partnerships. People's Health Clinic is grateful to partner with Early Childhood Alliance on providing diapers to the homes of those who need them most in Summit and Wasatch Counties. We also are collaborating with **Early Childhood Alliance** to create a video to promote our "Welcome Home Baby" program that provides free home visitation and education for new moms and their babies with the goal of Pre-K and Kindergarten readiness.

If you're a parent to, or caregiver of, young children—or a provider of early childhood services—here are two inspiring initiatives to be aware of:

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library mails free, age-appropriate, high-quality books each month to children under age five, without any other restrictions or eligibility criteria. These books are delivered directly to children's homes, so rural and urban communities can benefit from enrolling in the program.
