



### Dear Friends of The People's Health Clinic,

In 2019, I joined The People's Health Clinic as a volunteer internal medicine physician. After working as a hospitalist at the Park City Hospital, I wanted to prevent our uninsured community members from ending up in the ICU. At that point, I had lived in the community for 8 years, and I thought that I understood the health care disparities in our town. However, from my position of privilege, I was unaware of the depth of poverty in Park City.

With humility, I have learned about Park City through the stories of our patients. We have community members who have sought asylum in our town from all over the world including Venezuela, the Northern Triangle, and Ukraine. They have survived terrifying journeys across multiple borders to escape extreme violence. Our patients are grateful for the home they have found in Park City and for the opportunity to raise their children in safety.

With strength and grace, our patients build their new lives in Park City by working in jobs that overlook their residency status. They are employed by restaurants, hotels, and construction companies. They clean homes, watch children, and maintain landscaping. Some of our patients were engineers, teachers, or medical professionals before they immigrated. Others labored on farms or mining sites as children in their home countries and never had the opportunity to complete elementary school. Many of our patients work more than one job yet live below the federal poverty level, which is only \$13, 590 per year for a single adult. Their lack of residency status leads to exploitation in the workplace including unsafe working conditions, sexual assault, and labor trafficking.

At The People's Health Clinic, we hear stories of injustice and survival every week as our patients teach us what is most important in our lives. **Our mission to provide high-quality healthcare to the uninsured members in our community is deeply personal.** For several of our employees, the patients are their family members. Our employees are the first generation in their household to graduate from high school or college, and they are driven to give back to this community as future medical providers.

As CEO, my goal is to make our patients' stories known to the greater Park City community so that together we can solve health care disparities. **We can build a stronger community—one that empowers all members to live healthy and fulfilling lives.** With your continued support, we look with hope to the work ahead.



# PROVIDING HOPE & FIGHTING FOR \_\_\_\_\_ HEALTH EQUITY \_\_\_\_



The People's Health Clinic is a non-federally funded, volunteer-driven, community-supported non-profit clinic that provides high-quality, no cost healthcare to uninsured residents of Summit and Wasatch Counties in Utah. We are passionate about the service we provide and express our mission in three short but powerful words "Here, We Care."

Founded in 1999 by a group of concerned citizens, the clinic first provided healthcare from a mobile van. In 2009, in partnership with Summit County and Intermountain Health Care, the clinic moved to a permanent home in Round Valley. We serve patients 5 days a week.

In 2022, we provided approximately 12,500 patient encounters made possible by over 100 medical providers and staff volunteers. We are the only nonprofit clinic for the uninsured in the Wasatch Back. 67% of our patients earn less than the Federal Poverty Level or \$27,750 for a family of four. 97% of our patients have one or more jobs and many have two or three. 82% of our patients donate toward their own care. Most of our patients do not qualify for Medicaid due to their residency status and are unable to afford insurance through the marketplace. Our patients come from all over the world including Mexico, Honduras, Guatemala, El Salvador, Colombia, Venezuela, Peru, Argentina, Jamaica, Mongolia, Philippines, Romania, and Ukraine.

# AWARD-WINNING PATIENT CARE SPOTLIGHTS





#### NATIONAL 2022 ORGANIZATIONAL EXCELLENCE AWARD

The People's Health Clinic achieved the **2022 Organizational Excellence Award** by the Association of Clinicians for the Underserved (ACU) in Washington DC. This national award recognizes organizations that have implemented innovative and effective strategies to improve health care for underserved populations; and was based on our clinic's holistic approach to reducing health disparities among the uninsured residents of Summit and Wasatch Counties. *CEO Dr. Mairi Leining said upon receipt that "this honor reflects the exceptional work of our staff and volunteers, who are dedicated to ensuring that all of our community members receive high quality, comprehensive health care regardless of financial or legal status."* 

### **GOLD+ STATUS & PLATINUM DISTINCTION ACHIEVED**

This fall, The People's Health Clinic achieved the highest award, **the Gold+status**, from the American Medical Association and American Heart's Association's Target: BP Recognition Program. We were **one of 382 clinics recognized** out of 1,300+ health care organizations across the United States. We also achieved **Platinum Distinction** from The Utah Million Hearts Excellence in Blood Pressure Measurement and Control. This award, in conjunction with the Center for Disease Control Million Hearts® initiative, aims to prevent heart attacks and strokes by improving blood pressure management. **Our clinic was 1 of 7 clinics (113+ clinic total) in Utah** who attained the highest award offered by the program. The Million Hearts Coalition and the Utah Department of Health and Human Services asked Tristan Lubina, DNP, our Hypertension Program Director, to present his successful Hypertension Program strategy.

**Tristan Lubina, DNP,** received the 2022 Utah Nurse Practitioner State Award for Excellence in Leadership. **CEO Mairi Leining, MD,** was honored as a 2022 Healthcare Hero by Utah Business Magazine and one of the Top 50 Women Leaders of the Mountain Region for 2022 by Women We Admire.




### WOMEN'S HEALTH CAMPAIGN

With new, alarming urgency about women's health care access in 2022, The People's Health Clinic focused on the vital need to sustain and expand women's health care services at our clinic. A major donor stepped forward with a matching grant of \$150,000 dollars that was matched by individual donors to continue our critical work in Women's Health. At the end of July, over 300 community members joined us at our 2022 Walk & Wine, to support women's health services. The event raised a record-breaking \$275k to serve our thousands of patients locally. We were humbled by the community response! 
#### MENTAL HEALTH & BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES PROGRAMS

At The People's Health Clinic, our patient population faces unique challenges such as poverty, undocumented residency status, labor trafficking, and history of immigration trauma. Our clinic is actively addressing these social determinants of health as part of a new comprehensive mental health program. We have hired a full-time mental health nurse practitioner, Linsey Broadbent, DNP, to serve as our Mental Health Program Director. This program has been made possible with the committed support of the Katz Amsterdam Foundation, the Bleil Family Foundation and Marriott Daughters Foundation. We are collaborating with community partners at Holy Cross Ministries, Christian Center of Park City, Latino Behavioral Health Services and the University of Utah to develop a multi-faceted program with tiered levels of support services.



#### TUBERCULOSIS INFECTION TREATMENT PROGRAM

The People's Health Clinic started a latent tuberculosis (TB) infection treatment program to reduce the risk of active TB disease among our patient population. Supported by a grant from the Intermountain Community Care Foundation, we have screened 350 high-risk patients and provided numerous patients with free medication to date.



# GRANT & PATIENT FOCUS SPOTLIGHTS



### **EPIC PROMISE**

Epic Promise, Vail Resort's Grant, has provided vital funding to support our pediatric vision and dental programs.

The grant funds consultations at outside specialty clinics so uninsured patients are able to receive lifechanging vision and dental services.



### PLAYING FOR LIFE

The People's Health Clinic was awarded \$50,000 from our friends at the Playing for Life Foundation in support of breast cancer screenings and educational programming. Playing for Life is an incredible women-led foundation that partners with our work to help our patients receive breast imaging as well as education about breast cancer prevention!



### **PROMONTORY**

The Promontory Foundation chose The People's Health Clinic as the recipient of a select number of Impact Grants, and will fund patient care through general exams, women's health services and expanded mental health programming.

### **DAVID'S STORY**

For six years, David was unable to walk or work because of a debilitating foot injury. After treatment at The People's Health Clinic and a generous in-kind surgery through RCM Orthopedic Partners, David walked into our clinic this summer to thank us with flowers. Today, **David can work again** and is running a company that provides beautiful handmade flowers and fruit baskets for special events. We were honored to hire David for their colorful and talented services at our summer luncheon.



### **CARLA'S STORY**

Carla has DACA status and is the mother of four children. She suffers from depression, anxiety and a chronic skin disorder. We help Carla with birth control, dermatologic care, and management of her mental health issues. It is difficult to be a DACA recipient because regulations frequently change, and you need to apply to renew DACA status every 2 years. This fall Carla got a job as a medical assistant at the Park City Hospital but couldn't accept it because her DACA status had expired, and she was not legally allowed to work. Our clinic continues to advocate for patients like Carla as she navigates the legal system in the US, while struggling to support her family.


