# Our Patients

At the People's Health Clinic, our patients come from all over the world to work in the tourism industry. They have survived terrifying journeys across multiple borders to escape extreme violence. The majority live in poverty and struggle with food insecurity, language barriers, low health literacy, overcrowded living conditions, workplace exploitation, and history of immigration trauma. These socioeconomic factors negatively impact their health, and many suffer from preventable diseases. Because of their residency status, they are not eligible for Medicaid.

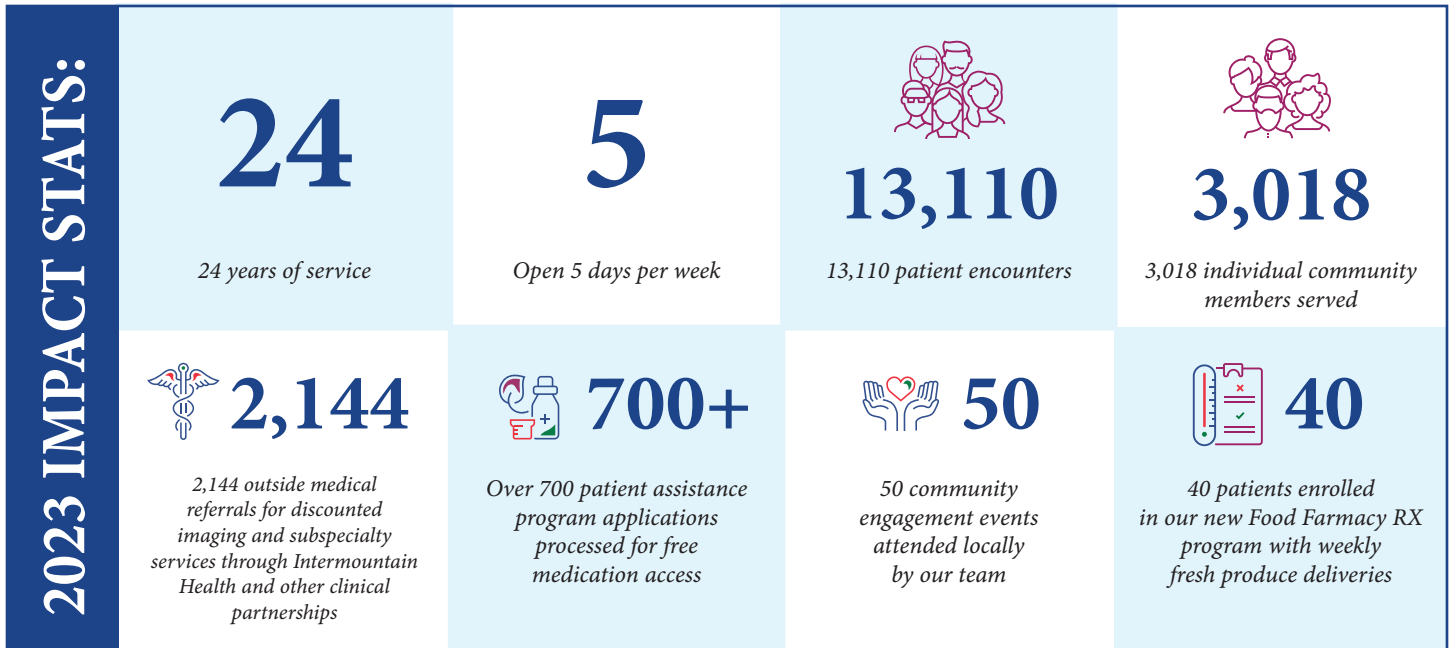

We provide comprehensive outpatient obstetric and gynecological care services including:

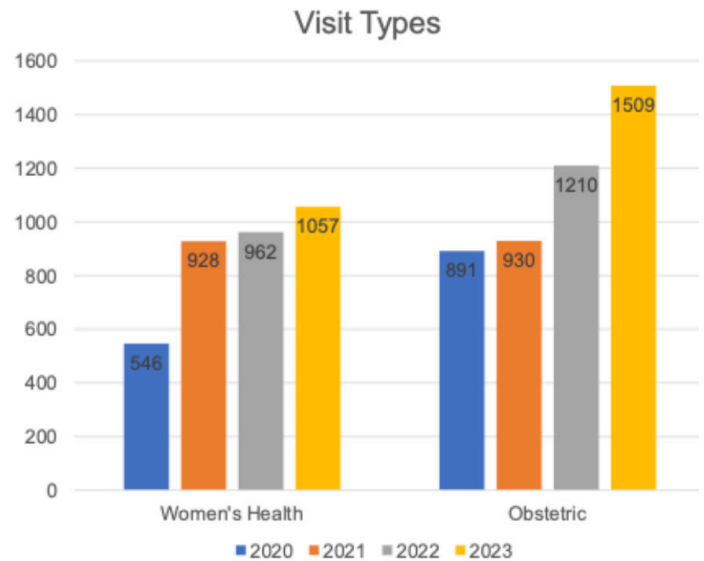
- Prenatal Care: viability imaging, aneuploidy screening, coordination of delivery planning

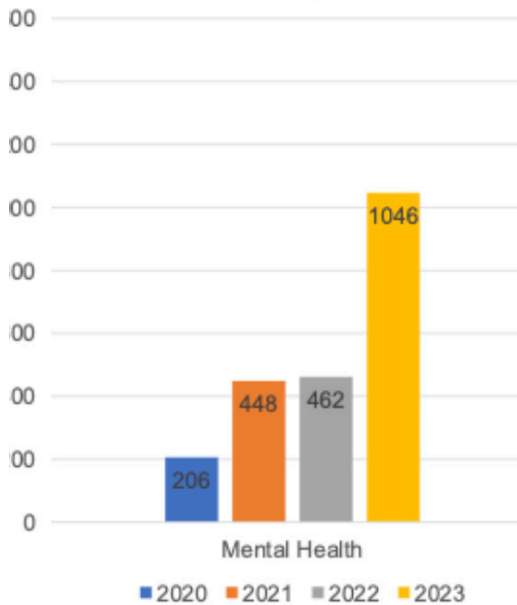

**A DIFFICULT DIAGNOSIS**

## An unrelenting rash

**CASE**  
A 64-year-old woman presented to her primary care provider with bilateral, painful pedal edema and universal skin lesions for the past 2 weeks.

**History** The patient reported that the pedal edema was associated with subjective fever, chills, orthopnea, and new skin lesions. The most concerning problem for her was the skin lesion on her neck that had been growing in size for the past 2 weeks (Figure 1). She denied chest pain, palpitations, dyspnea at rest or with exertion, night sweats, cough, and paresthesia.

The patient's past medical history included persistent, bilateral, lower extremity polyneuropathy for the past 2 years. This polyneuropathy presented historically as numbness and tingling and did not have a definitive diagnosis. The patient had established care with neurology and had an electromyogram 1 year ago, which showed disturbances to bilateral radial and peroneal nerves. Additional neurology evaluations and laboratory studies were pending, including thyroid-stimulating hormone, erythrocyte sedimentation rate, serum protein electrophoresis, methylmalonic acid, rapid plasma reagin, and anti-myelin-associated glycoprotein analysis. She also had a history of dermatologic diagnoses ranging from suspected urticaria to eczematous dermatitis, otherwise unspecified pruritus, and dermatofibromas.

Her medical history also included prediabetes, essential hypertension, hypercholesterolemia, vitamin D deficiency, and

**Programa de diabetes: improving diabetes care for undocumented immigrants using the Chronic Care Model at a free community clinic**



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**Abstract**  
**Aims** This study examined whether the Chronic Care Model can be successfully applied to improve health outcome measures for uninsured, undocumented immigrants with diabetes at a free, non-federally funded community clinic.  
**Methods** Data were collected from 128 uninsured, undocumented immigrants enrolled in *Programa de diabetes*, a comprehensive diabetes program at People's Health Clinic based on the six core elements of the Chronic Care Model. All study participants self-identified by the Hispanic ethnicity. A longitudinal study design was used to compare baseline diabetic health measures with outcome data after patient program participation over a 12-month enrollment period. Linear mixed effect model was used to determine the patient specific change in HbA1C across time, controlling for gender, age, food insecurity, income level, diabetes type, and literacy. In addition, McNemar tests were conducted to compare the coverage of eye exams and statin use before and after program enrollment.  
**Results** After program enrollment, individual specific change in HbA1C was expected to be  $-0.201$  [95% CI 0.244,  $-0.158$ ] % per month after controlling for baseline covariates. There were statistically significant improvements in both eye exam coverage ( $p < 0.01$ ) and statin use ( $p < 0.01$ ).  
**Conclusions** The Chronic Care Model can be successfully applied to improve health outcome measures at a free, non-federally funded community clinic among uninsured, undocumented immigrants, who identify by the Hispanic ethnicity and have the diagnosis of diabetes. Barriers to care including food insecurity, federal poverty level and illiteracy do not preclude glyceemic control.

**LTBI Prevalence Among At-Risk, Undocumented Immigrants at a Free Clinic in Rural Utah**

**Background**  
Latent Tuberculosis (LTBI) is a global health concern, particularly among at-risk populations. In rural Utah, a high proportion of the population is uninsured and undocumented immigrants, who are at increased risk of LTBI. This study aimed to determine the prevalence of LTBI among this population at a free community clinic.

**Preliminary Results**  
The study included 128 participants. The prevalence of LTBI was 12.5% (95% CI 8.5–17.5%). The prevalence was significantly higher among undocumented immigrants (18.8%) compared to insured participants (5.2%).

**Discussion and Implications**  
The findings of this study highlight the high prevalence of LTBI among uninsured and undocumented immigrants in rural Utah. This population is at increased risk of LTBI due to factors such as poverty, food insecurity, and limited access to healthcare. The findings suggest that targeted interventions, such as TB screening and treatment, are needed to reduce the burden of LTBI in this population.

**Next Steps**  
The next steps include conducting a full-scale study to determine the prevalence of LTBI among this population. Additionally, efforts should be made to improve access to TB screening and treatment for this population.

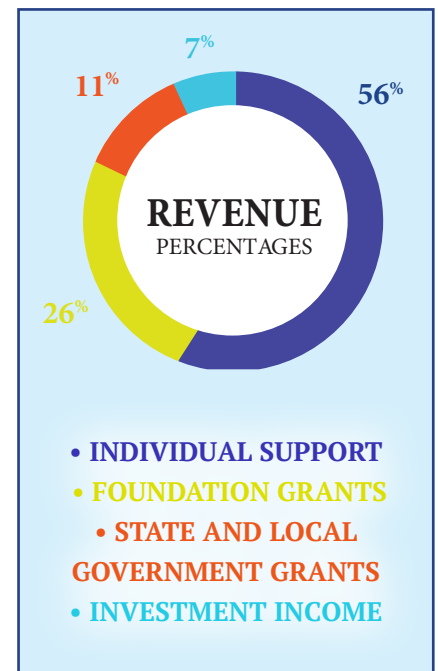

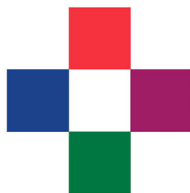

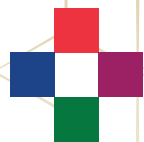
